


OBJECTIVES



After completing this training, participants should be able to:

- ✓ define terms used in everyday language and clinical contexts;
- ✓ make connections between terms used in everyday language and clinical contexts and the theoretical notions and research outcomes associated with them;
- ✓ apply an analytical framework to the phenomena discussed in the training session;
- ✓ identify risk and protective factors associated with violent radicalization;
- ✓ identify how these factors may vary given particular sociodemographic characteristics (gender, age, immigration status or generation of immigrant, ethnic and religious group, identification with the majority or minorities);
- ✓ reject culturalist explanations, avoid stigmatization, and understand the phenomenon of social polarization;
- ✓ apply inclusive strategies and intersectorial collaboration in situations involving violent radicalization while respecting the clinical and ethical mandates of all sectors concerned.

APPROACH

INTEGRATIVE

Training offered by two **co-facilitators** – a researcher and a practitioner. Aiming to promote knowledge exchange and ongoing collaboration, the training fosters exchange and engagement with material drawn from participants' workplace contexts.

PERSONALIZED

Various formats are available to meet your needs and time constraints:

- 1. Express 3-hour Training:** awareness-building and introduction to approaches and resources for prevention and intervention.
- 2. À la Carte Training,** with your choice of a combination of:
 - General module/basic training (3 hours): Theoretical basics for understanding violent radicalization among youth. Conceptual and contextual overview; risk and protective factors; approaches to prevention.
 - Specialized complementary modules (1-3 hours): 1) Principles of prevention; 2) Principles of clinical intervention; 3) How to support families?
- 3. Training for Educational Settings:** the general and complementary modules can be adapted for educators to meet the needs and realities of educational settings.

TRAINING OVERVIEW



This training is part of a ministerial mandate administered by the **University Institute with Regard to Cultural Communities**, which is affiliated with the *CIUSSS du Centre-Ouest-de-l'Île-de-Montréal*. As a part of the CIUSS, the **SHERPA** Research and Training Centre, and in particular the **RAPS** (Research and Action on Social Polarisation) team, has been tasked with implementing.

The training deals with a highly publicized and sensitive issue that is a topic of polarizing social debate: violent radicalization among Quebec youth. The phenomenon is analysed using a critical societal approach that emphasizes intercommunity and gender relations, as well as factors contributing to exclusion, discrimination and racism. Cognitive and emotional dimensions of the phenomenon are also discussed.



The training includes presentations, discussions, practical exercises and case studies.

Participants will receive a list of suggested readings and audio-visual materials.
